Summary of Catch-up Premium Use

Catch-up premium is being spent in line with the school's priority areas for school improvement. Firstly, an experienced English teacher has been employed to run 1:2:1 and small group sessions. Working primarily with low ability, PP and SEND students with the focus on improving literacy levels. This intervention will support improved outcomes for these students in all subjects.

The next part of the funding is being used to improve student access to ICT to support the school's closing the gaps strategy.

Targeted use of the catch up premium

In line with the Education Endowment Foundation (EEF) guidance we have linked all activities being funded by the Catch-up Premium to the 3 support strategies that make up their tiered model to curriculum planning. A significant proportion of the whole school budget has already been allocated to high quality teaching, so we feel the best use of the catch up premium is to support the 2 other key areas highlighted by the EEF.

1. High Quality Teaching e.g. Professional development, assessment, remote learning program
2. Targeted Academic Support e.g. one to one support, small group tuition, redeployment of Teaching Assistants
3. Wider Strategies e.g. Parental engagement, social and emotional learning
