



The School re-opens 8.30am on Monday 24th February


On Monday 24th February, students will return to lessons as normal. Students are expected to be on site by 8.25am, fully equipped for their lessons.

To prevent students being caught out on the first day back with regards to our expectations and rules, the following slides contain reminders for what we expect.



Important Messages!

1. Painted, acrylic and false nails must be removed prior to students returning to school. Students will not be allowed to enter normal lessons until these issues have been resolved.
2. All students must be wearing plain black, polishable, leather style formal shoes, with no branding or logos . Trainers are not allowed. Students will not be allowed to enter normal lessons until footwear issues have been resolved.
3. Coats must not be worn indoors. This will be an automatic conduct card point should this rule be breached.
4. Mobile phones are banned in school unless students are given explicit permission to use one by a member of staff. This extends to all mobile devices including smart watches. These will be confiscated as per the Mobile Device Policy.
5. Hair colour must be of natural colours; extreme hair styles and colours are not permitted and hair decorations are not allowed. Students will not be allowed to enter normal lessons until these issues have been resolved.
6. Students must arrive to school for 8.25am. At this time gates close and late detentions will be issued to students arriving after this time.
7. The only jewellery permitted is: one pair of stud sleeper earrings, one ring, one watch. No bracelets or facial piercings.
8. Students must not be in ICT rooms unsupervised at any time.



9. Punctuality is expected from every student. If a student is late, then a late mark is entered and they will be issued with a detention.

10. Students are expected to go the shortest route to their lessons and will be challenged via their conduct card if this is not the case.

11. Students should not be visiting toilets during lesson time unless it is an emergency.

12. First Aid is for emergencies not for general illness and issues such as feeling sick and period pains are not first aid issues.
