Teenage Vaccination Programme Survey

Several immunisations are offered to young people in their teenage years to give them protection against serious infectious diseases. Public Health England (PHE) carries out surveys each year to explore and monitor attitudes towards the national vaccination programme among young people aged 13-15 years and their parents. It is important for PHE to know what people think about this vaccination programme. The survey is carried out by BMG, an independent research agency, commissioned by PHE.
