Transition Youth Club

As part of welcoming you to Baysgarth School, we are running a Transition Youth Club over three weeks in the summer term after school. The Youth Club will be run by Baysgarth teachers, who are excited to meet you before you join our school in September.

The Youth Club is a chance for us to get to know you and give you an opportunity to meet other new students in your House. You will also have the chance to meet lots of your new teachers and get used to the school building.

When you join us for your first Youth Club session you will find out which House you have been placed in and take part in lots of exciting activities in different subjects, including Humanities, Science, PE and Languages. We know that changing schools is exciting but also a little daunting, so your new teachers at Baysgarth have created activities that are challenging and fun; they are designed to support this important transition and help ease you into your new school.

The sessions will run on a Tuesday evening on the following dates after the half term break.

- **Tuesday 4th June (This will be for the students only who have a place in the Nurture Group from September)**
- Tuesday 11th June
- Tuesday 18th June
- Tuesday 25th June

The sessions will start at 4.00pm and your parents or carers will need to organise transporting you to Baysgarth for this time. Your new teachers will be ready to meet you from 3.45pm. You will need to come into school through the main reception at the front of school and from here you will be taken to your activities. Refreshments will be available at the start and end of the sessions. You will need to arrange with your parents or carers to be collected at 6.30pm promptly.
