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1. Introduction

At Baysgarth School we develop a sense of PRIDE in our community and a sense of belonging. The school uniform is an important part of creating this identity and presenting a professional image within our local community.

A high standard of personal appearance is expected of all students and staff. A professional attire and fully equipped for learning is an expectation of all members of Baysgarth School.

2. Aims of Policy

The aims of the uniform policy at Baysgarth School are:

- Establish clear expectations for student dress and appearance
- Establish PRIDE in our school community
- Establish a sense of community and belonging
- Provide a professional image for the school
- Provide clear guidance to students and parents

All leaders within the school are relentless in their role to establish a positive learning climate. They are uncompromising in their expectations and challenge where appropriate colleagues, students and parents.

Girls Uniform

Grey Suit Jacket	A grey suit jacket, which includes the school logo.
Grey suit trousers or skirt	A grey knee length skirt which matches the suit jacket or formal, classic trousers to match the suit jacket. Plain black belts may be worn but no fashion belts or large buckles.
White shirt	Standard white, loose fitting shirt with pointed collar and top button. Blouses are not allowed. Shirts must be long enough to tuck into trousers or skirts and wide enough at the neck to fasten the top button.
Tie	Striped tie in House colours. Prefects to have black striped tie in house colours.
Grey V neck jumper	This is optional. Grey v neck jumper with the school logo
Socks	Plain black or white
Tights	Black tights, minimum 40 denier Patterned tights or leggings are not permitted
Footwear	Plain black leather shoes or ankle boots that are polishable. Flat or low heels. Trainers, UGG boots, sandals, plimsolls, knee length boots not permitted. Ankle boots may be worn under school trousers but not with skirts.
Jewellery	Watch One ring One small stud in each ear. Badges (except school and birthday) are not permitted. Charity bands, loom bands are not permitted. No facial piercings are permitted.
Nail varnish	This is not permitted. Acrylic and artificial nails are not permitted.
Hair	Hair decorations such as bows are not permitted. No extreme styles or colours. Hair colour should be a natural colour.

Boys' Uniform

Grey Suit Jacket	A grey suit jacket, which includes the school logo.
Grey suit trousers	Formal, classic trousers to match the suit jacket. Plain black belts may be worn but no fashion belts or large buckles.
White shirt	Standard white, loose fitting shirt with pointed collar and top button. Shirts must be long enough to tuck into trousers or skirts and wide enough at the neck to fasten the top button.
Tie	Striped tie in House colours. Prefects to have black striped tie in house colours.
Grey V neck jumper	This is optional. Grey v neck jumper with the school logo
Socks	Plain black or white
Footwear	Plain black leather shoes that are polishable. Trainers, plimsolls are not permitted.
Jewellery	Watch One ring One small stud in each ear. Badges (except school and birthday) are not permitted. Charity bands, loom bands are not permitted. No facial piercings are permitted.
Nail varnish	This is not permitted. Acrylic and artificial nails are not permitted.
Hair	Hair decorations are not permitted. No extreme styles or colours. Hair colour should be a natural colour.

3. Wearing the School Uniform

Students are expected to be in full school uniform every day. This is part of being equipped and ready to learn. Any student who fails to wear the correct uniform or wears the uniform incorrectly will face a consequence. This is the form of warnings within a classroom or negative comments on conduct cards outside of lesson time. Appendix 1 and 2 outline how this is dealt with within school.

Students are expected to have their top button done up at all times and blazers are expected to be worn at all times. When students are in lessons, classroom teachers may give permission for students to remove their blazers and place on the back of their chairs. On occasions in the summer months, the Head Teacher may relax this rule on health and safety grounds.

Students who refuse to correct their uniform will face a day's isolation due to the refusal of a reasonable request. Parents will be contacted and the issue discussed with their child's Learning Manager or Head of House.

If your child has an issue with their uniform, please contact the school promptly first thing in the morning so we can support your child in resolving the issue. The school has a large supply of spare uniform which is loaned to students.

4. Adverse Weather Conditions

During periods of adverse weather students are permitted to:

- Wear a plain white T-shirt or vest under their shirt. T-shirts must be plain white without any pictures, logos or branding
- Wear a grey V neck jumper with the school logo
- Wear wellingtons or sturdy shoes to school and then change into school footwear when they reach the school

5. Coats

Coats should be plain and dark coloured with no visible logos. The following are not permitted:

- Denim jackets
- Hoodies
- Leather jackets
- Coats with studs
- Coats with offensive messages / logos
- Tracksuit tops

Coats are not permitted in the school building and should be removed upon entry.

6. Hats and Scarves

Hats and headwear are not permitted in school unless for religious observance. Students should remove hats and scarves upon entry to the building.

7. Hair

Hair styles should not be extreme and should be of natural colour. Colours such as pink, green, blue and bright red are not permitted.

8. Facial Piercings

Facial piercings are not permitted. Students will be isolated if they arrive at school with a piercing until the issue is resolved.


9. PE Lessons

Compulsory Kit	Black Baysgarth PE T-Shirt (with school logo) Black PE shorts Black Football socks Suitable Trainers (Should be supportive, NOT plimsolls or High Tops) Football boots with moulded plastic studs. Studs should be rounded, not sharp. No metal studs or blades.
Compulsory for Football & Hockey lessons	Shin Pads
Optional Kit	Baysgarth Training Top (recommended for cold weather) Plain Black tracksuit bottoms/Sports leggings (at the discretion of staff – Winter only) Compression/Thermal Top Black Gloves
Optional Sport Specific Kit	Gum Shield Running Spikes
Hair	Must be tied back for all activities if hair covers face. Students will be required to bring their own hair bobble.
Jewellery	No jewellery of any kind is permitted.

10. Exemptions

As part of the school's commitment to being an inclusive school, students may be exempt from aspects of this policy on the grounds of religion and culture. Requests should be made in writing to the Head Teacher.

APPENDIX 1



If you turn up to a PE lesson with no/incorrect PE kit, the consequences will be as follows.

If this is the first time that this has happened, you will be given a formal warning and a kit mark will be placed next to your name on the register.

Additionally, you may be lent some kit by the PE staff and will still be expected to partake in the

If this is the second time that this has happened, You will be given a faculty detention, a further kit mark placed next to your name, and may be lent kit to partake in the lesson.

If this is the third time that this has happened, you will be given an after-school detention, a further kit mark placed next to your name, and may be lent kit to partake in the lesson.
